

Project Narrative

Valhalla Brandywine (Heim) – Golf Course, Spa and Residential Community Wallace Township, Chester County

Project Overview

Valhalla Brandywine (Heim) is a proposed Golf Course and Spa and residential community proposed in Wallace Township, Chester County, PA. The project will consist of an 18 hole golf course and a clubhouse, spa, restaurant and banquet facility covering approximately 200,000 SF. The golf course and associated facilities will be located on approximately 260 acres of property. Additionally there will be a residential portion of the project that will contain up to 175 residential dwellings located on a tract of ground covering approximately 60 acres. These two parcels of ground are located adjacent to one another and combined make up a total project land area of approximately 288 acres.

The project will be connected to, and entirely serviced by an existing off-site community water delivery and supply system and a community sewage disposal system. The wastewater discharge effluent from the project will be discharged on land via spray irrigation system from a lagoon treatment process nearby.

Description of Environment

The project consists of 2 parcels of property totaling approximately 288 acres. The first parcel of property is approximately 228 acres and will be used for the construction of the golf course and clubhouse/spa facility. This property is an old diary farm that has not been actively used for more than 50 years. The land is covered with a mixture of open fields, emergent woodlands and mature woodlands. There is a small unnamed tributary on the northern portion of this property that flows into the East Branch of the Brandywine Creek. The East Branch of the Brandywine Creek is located to the west of the property. There are also a few existing structures and a few small ponds located on the property as well. A wetland delineation is ongoing at the time of this PNDI search. Wetlands have been identified along the unnamed tributary and ponds located on the site.

The second parcel of land is approximately 60 acres and will be used for the residential portion of the project. The property is an abandoned quarry that has not been used for several years. The property is covered with a mixture of disturbed land, emergent fields, scrub shrub and emergent woodlands. Other than the abandoned quarry, there are no other bodies of water located on the property.
