
#### **COMPONENT 3, SECTION F. PROJECT NARRATIVE**

(numbering corresponds to A Guidance for Completing Component 3")

- 1. Rose Hollow Subdivision is a proposed nine (9) lot single family residential project located on the south side of State Road and the east side of Rose Hill Road in London Grove Township, Chester County, PA. The project includes an existing house which will be razed and proposes the construction of nine (9) new dwellings.
- 2. Wastewater flows for the project were calculated using 225 gallons per day per dwelling unit (gpd/du) for each of the lots. The total daily sewage flows anticipated for this site is calculated to be 2,025 gpd as per the Township's Act 537 Plan.
  - The total number of equivalent dwelling units (edu's) is estimated based on the total anticipated flow divided by 400 gpd/du. The number of edu's was calculated to be 5.1 edu's.
- 3. Wastewater will be conveyed to the London Grove Township Municipal Authority's Conard Pyle Wastewater Facility (WQM Permit # 1508411). The wastewater will be treated and disposed at the LGTMA's Conard Pyle facility. The wastewater facility has been permitted by PADEP for construction but construction has not yet been initiated at the time of the Planning Module report preparation. The temporary use of holding tanks/pump and haul facilities is proposed as part of this planning submission in the event the construction of the Municipal system is not completed at the time anticipated occupancy of the proposed homes in Rose Hollow subdivision. An Installation, Operation, and Maintenance Agreement (draft) for such temporary use is included in Section F of this report.
- 4. For this application the domestic wastewater flow of 2,025 gpd was calculated based upon 225 gallons per day per dwelling unit, as requested by the Township engineer and consistent with the Township's Act 537 plan.
- 5. The wastewater treatment and disposal will be the LGTMA's Conard Pyle wastewater treatment and spray irrigation facility located south of the Rose Hollow project.
- 6. The total tract size of the subdivision is 12.212 acres.
- 7. There are no surrounding parcels of ground under the same ownership. The project site is located in a residential/agricultural land use area. The surrounding area of the project site is served by individual onlot sewage disposal systems.



8. No PADEP Act 537 planning approvals have previously been completed for the project site.

#### **COMPONENT 3, SECTION H. ALTERNATIVE ANALYSIS**

(numbering corresponds to AGuidance for Completing Component 3")

- The chosen method of wastewater treatment and disposal for the proposed Rose Hollow Subdivision is the LGTMA's Conard Pyle facility. The total number of EDU's calculated for the proposed subdivision is based on the annual average sewage flow for each house divided by the number of gallons in an EDU. Based upon the 2,025 gpd flow and the PADEP standard of 400 gpd/edu, 5.1 edu's are proposed.
- 2. The predominant land uses surrounding the site are single-family residential properties and agricultural land use. The property south of the project site is the LGTMA's Conard Pyle Treatment facility site. Individual, on-lot sewage disposal systems serve the sewage disposal needs for the residences surrounding the proposed subdivision.
- 3. There are no known widespread sewage disposal malfunctions adjacent to the proposed development. There is no current need to improve the existing subsurface sewage disposal facilities which surround this proposed development.
- 4. The London Grove Township Act 537 Plan indicates the use of Municipal sewage disposal.
- 5. The LGTMA's Conard Pyle Wastewater facility is by definition a public sewerage system. The Rose Hollow wastewater collection and conveyance components will be conveyed to the LGTMA after construction. The individual properties owners will be responsible for maintaining their respective laterals in accordance with LGTMA standards, and in accordance with the Grinder Pump agreement, a draft of which is included in Appendix F. The agreement will be finalized and executed as part of the Part 2 permit submission to PADEP.
- 6. The use of individual onlot sewage disposal systems to serve each of the lots was originally considered for the project. Due to the small lot sizes and the marginal suitability of soils in the lower topographic areas of the site, the use of individual onlot systems was not considered to be the most environmentally preferred alternative for the project site. Similarly, the use of community land-based alternatives was also considered. Given the relatively small size of the project site and the proposed municipal land-based system on the adjacent property, the use of a small community system was not considered to be the most environmentally or administratively preferred option. The LGTMA's Conard Pyle treatment facility is to be located on properties south of the subject site and conveyance lines are proposed along Rose Hill Road along our project site. Connection to this Municipal facility, which will utilize aerated lagoons and spray irrigation, is considered to be the most environmentally and administratively preferred alternative to serve the project site.

- 7. Discussed in comment #6 above.
- 8. The LGTMA will be the owner of the treatment and disposal facility, and will be responsible for operation and maintenance of the facility and ultimately compliance with applicable water quality standards and effluent limitations.
